ACCREDITATION REPORT: UNIVERSITY OF OTAGO

POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT AND INTERVENTION

(PGDipPAI)

Introduction:

It is a function of the New Zealand Psychologists Board (the Board) to prescribe the qualification required for scope of practice within the profession, and for that purpose, to accredit and monitor educational institutions and degrees, courses of studies, or programmes (as per section 118(a) of the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003 (the Act)). On 2nd November 2011 the Board delegated its powers under section 118(a) of the Act to accredit educational institutions and degrees, courses of studies, or programme to the Accreditation Committee. Applications for accreditation are assessed with reference to the relevant sections of the Board's prescribed *Standards and Procedures for the Accreditation of Qualifications Leading to Registration as a Psychologist in New Zealand* (the Standards) document.

Date of Application:

The University of Otago lodged a submission to gain accreditation for the PGDipPAI, in 2026, with a view to graduates being eligible to register in the Psychology Assistant scope of Practise. The Accreditation Committee considered the submission regarding provisional accreditation.

Date of Decision:

10 July 2026

Decision:

The University of Otago's PGDipPAI course of study has been granted provisional accreditation with graduates eligible to apply for registration in the Psychology Assistant scope of practice. In accordance with the Standards, a full accreditation assessment, including a site visit by a Board appointed Assessment Team, will occur once the first cohort of students is eligible for graduation anticipated to be month year.
